

To ensure the highest quality and relevance, *LINK Center* partnered with seasoned SPED teachers who possess extensive experience in working with deaf students. This collaboration forms the core of the Online Teachers Enhancement Program- Development of Resource Materials(OTEP-DRM), a groundbreaking initiative aimed at equipping teachers with the tools they need to accommodate students who are deaf in inclusive educational settings.

The primary objective of OTEP is to develop resource materials that will serve as a guiding light for teachers seeking to provide an inclusive education to students who are deaf. Resource materials being developed will be accessible through LINK Center's website once it has beenpublished.






#### **Project under Boeing Global Engagement**

In January 2023, online training programs commenced for five groups of participants who are deaf from different regions, covering diverse areas such as food bars, home cuisine, cake decoration, food processing, and dressmaking.


Despite facing challenges in coordinating training for diverse groups, LINK Center's determination and BOEING's unwavering support helped overcome these obstacles.

### **2023 SIGN LANGUAGE TRAINING** KEEP THE HEART'S DESIRE LEARNING SIGN LANGUAGE, BURNING!



**LINK Center for the Deaf Inc.** has been offering free Sign Language Training to Regular/Receiving teachers who work with deaf students. The primary aim of this program is to empower these teachers with the essential skills needed to effectively communicate and connect with their deaf students as these students are mainstreamed in regular classes.

Over the years, the program has seen remarkable success, with six (6) batches comprising 85 teachers each graduating from the *Intermediate Sign Language Level (BSL)*. These teachers have demonstrated exceptional dedication and commitment by taking on the challenge of pursuing the *Advance Sign Language Level (ISL)*, despite their demanding schedules at school and their responsibilities in their respective homes.

LINK Center recognizes the significant impact these teachers have in the lives of deaf students. By equipping them with advanced sign language skills, the center aims to enhance the educational experience of deaf students in a mainstream society and enable them to reach their full potential. The commitment and dedication shown by these teachers serve as a beacon of inspiration for the entire education community.



May the Creator of Life help us create a society where everyone can thrive, regardless of their abilities or differences. To God be the glory!



- 3.SEC Policies: The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) in the Philippines regulates non-profit organizations and may have specific policies or guidelines in place for NGOs or SWDAs. The webinar may have addressed these SEC policies, focusing on compliance on requirements or other relevant information.



The Board was provided with detailed updates on the various programs and services offered by the organization. The meeting also served as a venue for suggestions by the Board.




### **SERVICES**




#### **2. Sign Language Class:**
